Two ways to drop off your soup donations:

- Drive-in Sunday services as you exit the parking lot
- Church office inside office foyer between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m., Monday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday

Donations of other non-perishable food can also be given at that time. Financial donations to the Interfaith Food Center are also always welcomed and appreciated (checks can be made out to St. Andrew with IFC in the memo line).
