

Responding to ELCA World Hunger's Global Farm Challenge

\$715 gives a family farm a fresh start
Small farms produce more than a third of the world's
food, yet as many as half of the world's hungry people
live on farms. In the US, farm workers are more than
twice as likely to experience poverty as other workers.
Ending hunger isn't just about food. It means recognizing
the ways God is at work in farming communities and the
ways God is calling all of us, together, to be part of the
solution.

The ELCA's Global Farm Challenge is a fundraising challenge to raise \$525,000 to equip communities around the world and in the US with livestock, seeds, tools and training that can change everything for small farms.

Investments in small farmers can have a huge impact on

ending hunger and poverty, and building resilience for whole communities.

St. Andrew has accepted the challenge

Beginning this month, St. Andrew will be participating in the ELCA's challenge with a goal of raising \$715, which will give a family farm a fresh start by providing a cow, two goats, two pigs, a dozen chicks, farming tools, seeds and agricultural training and support.

To help us reach our fundraising goal, please write your check to St. Andrew, with "Global Farm Challenge" in the memo line, and drop it in the offering plate.

Thank you for your continued support to help those in need. Your gift can help make a difference for a family hoping to escape the cycle of poverty for good. We will be collecting donations to reach our goal through August, and will keep you apprised of our progress.

St. Andrew begins new ministry in Peru

Dear St. Andrew members:

As you know, since we ended our ministry in Pachacamac, Peru, a few years ago, we have been looking for a similar effort that we could support. Through several conversations over many months with the ELCA representative for South America, Gustavo Driau, I believe we have found such a church.

San Juan Camino de Esperanza (St. John Road of Hope) is located in Lima, Peru, in what is considered one of the districts with the highest population growth in South America (1,100,000 inhabitants as of 2015). The area is impacted by poverty, lack of basic services (water

and sewage), and scarcity of employment (street vendor is a typical job), which has only worsened since the pandemic.

Despite those challenges, San Juan continues to minister to the surrounding community. Typical weekly activities include Sunday - adult worship; Saturday - Saturday school for girls and boys; Tuesday - visits with families; and Wednesday - prayer and Bible study.

Since 2000, the congregation has been working with children and adolescents, the most important of their programs being, "Sowing for the Future." The program currently ministers to about 50 children and adolescents aged 3-16 with homework support, educational and spiritual activities, and a small food reinforcement. They also provide various educational opportunities for parents to help them climb out of poverty.

In conversation with the leaders of San Juan, Gustavo has identified three immediate needs:

- 1. To make the lunches that we offer to children and youth on Saturdays. Consisting of oatmeal, milk, butter, sugar, bread, and gas. \$ 350.00
- 2. We need to make a screen to protect the classroom from the cold where we meet with the children and youth. \$
 180.00
- 3. In our congregation, four young people (3 ladies and ½ young man) finished high school, but due to a lack of resources, they did not continue their studies. So we are encouraging them to study technical courses offered by the state, and they only need to take an exam and pay the tuition. Some of them have a ticket and the supplies

they will use this year. \$ 300.00

These projects seem very reasonable but can make a difference for the youth of San Juan. We would fund them with the remainder of our Peru team account, money from our Mission and Service projects account, and any money that is donated by our congregation. If you wish to contribute on a one-time and/or ongoing basis, please feel free to write a check to St. Andrew with "Peru projects" in the memo line, and drop it in the offering plate. Any money raised that is beyond the current needs will be reserved for future projects with San Juan.

We will keep you posted on our efforts with San Juan in the coming weeks and months. If you have any questions about this, please feel free to let me know.
