⁵ These twelve JESUS sent out with the following instructions: "Do not go among the Gentiles or enter any town of the Samaritans. ⁶ Go rather to the lost sheep of Israel. ⁷ As you go, preach this message: 'The kingdom of heaven is near.' ⁸ Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy, drive out demons. 4) Read Romans 5:1-8. How are "justification from sin" and "peace with GOD" related? Why can we rejoice in suffering? Of what hope does Paul speak here? What does Paul say is amazing about CHRIST'S death on the cross?

5) Read Matthew 9:35-10:8. Why does JESUS feel such great compassion for the people? What two images does JESUS use to describe those who have been distanced from the love of GOD? What is JESUS' plan for sharing the good news with these people?
